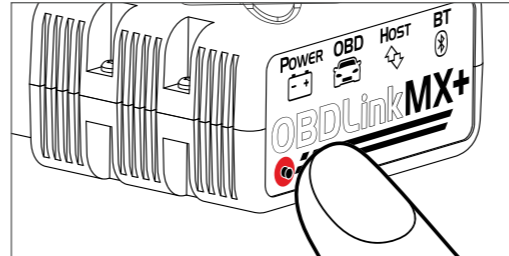


3. Plug MX+ into the OBD port

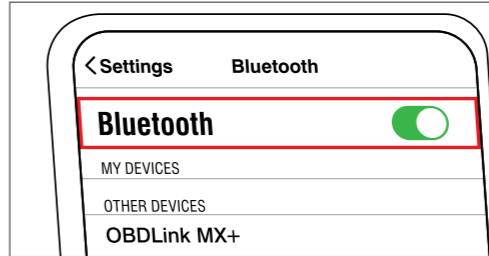


OBD port is usually in driver's footwell

4. Push the "Pair" button

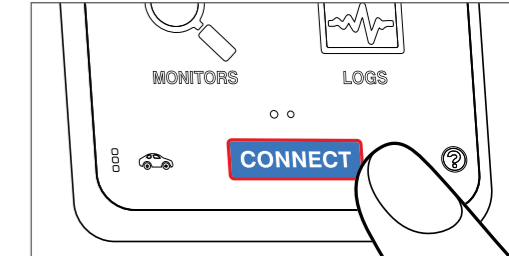


5. Go to Device Settings → Bluetooth and pair with "OBDLink MX+"



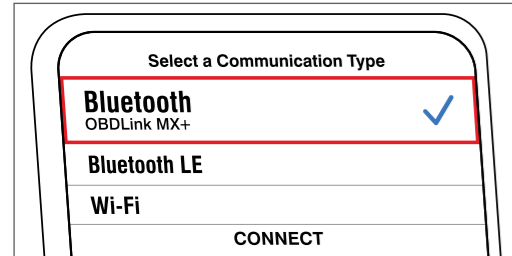

6. Launch the OBDLink app and tap "Connect"



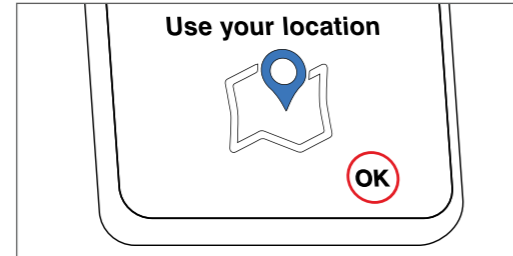
Continue to step 7

7. Select the “Bluetooth” option in Communication Type



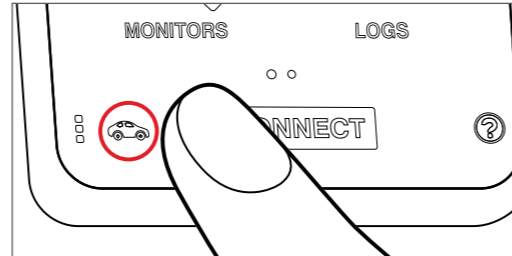
If you don't get this prompt, go to the OBDLink app → Settings → Preferences → Communications

Location data is used to enable the map feature and stays on the device

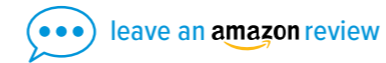

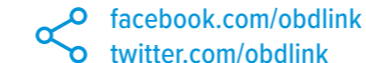
Tap the Vehicle Editor icon, and enter the **Year, Make, Model, and Option** to see if an enhanced OEM add-on is available

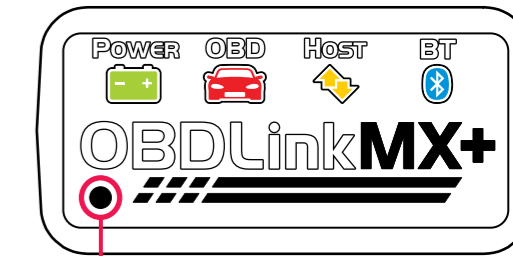
